Israel is the largest stakeholder in the Eastern Mediterranean and development of Israeli gas reserves is reaching a critical point. Israel hopes to begin exporting gas to Egypt by 2017. Development of the gas fields requires intellectual, financial, equipment and technological resources. This session will have a sequence of presentations, detailing top issues facing the Israeli oil and gas sector offshore and onshore.

1:30 PM – 3:00 PM SESSION 2: Emerging Technologies and Trends

Huge discoveries of natural gas offshore Israel has signaled the Eastern Mediterranean as a new frontier for the development of natural gas resources. The United States Geological Survey (USGS) estimates that the Levant basin could potentially hold as much as 125 TCF of recoverable gas. Reports are primary indications of the basin's considerable potential. This session will discuss engineering, design and technology specific to Israel's current offshore/onshore status, seismic field development, and data integration.

3:30 PM – 5:00 PM PANEL DISCUSSION: Regulations, Licensing, Antitrust Uncertainty

Months of uncertainty regarding regulation over the issue of a gas monopoly caused delays in the Leviathan project. A breakthrough has now been achieved in the talks between the natural gas companies and the Israeli government on the compromise plan for the gas sector. Antitrust uncertainty had forced suspending investments in the Tamar and Leviathan projects, pending resolution of regulatory issues. The government plans on opening the industry to more competition. This panel discussion will be informative and up-to-the-minute discussing details, developments and nuances on how the current climate will influence Israel's prospects.

This session will provide sequential presentations and multiple presenters discussing these topics and also identify the key challenges, drivers and restraints in the country's oil and gas industry, and the impact of these metrics on the industry.

Gas exports to Egypt in commercial quantities and greater capacity for gas supply to the Israeli market, with the construction of an additional pipeline from the Tamar reservoir, are included in the recent agreement. Coupled with a dedicated strategy for gas prices and taxation of export, Israel forecasts this will lead to developing the gas fields and bring new companies into the market. This panel will explore the potential investment opportunities in Israel, how much investment is needed, and the risks and opportunities for investors/oil and gas companies. Projected global impact on Israel's energy resources, financial resources, project finance, maximizing investment opportunities will be discussed.

The emergence of Israel as a Mediterranean energy player presents a regional strategic change. The Tamar and the Leviathan gas fields are developed at the very moment when the energy relations between the Middle East countries, and those of the North of the Mediterranean Sea, especially Turkey, Greece, as well as the European Union are shifting. This shift in the relations of Israel with its political environment follows three distinct junctures: the energy and strategic cooperation with Egypt and Jordan, the discussions with Cyprus and Greece, and the multifaceted relationship with the Russian energy strategy, which involves Turkey.
